For if their rejection is the reconciliation of the world, what will their acceptance be but life from the dead? For the gifts and the call of God are

irrevocable. Just as you once disobeyed God but have now received mercy because of their disobedience, so they have now disobeyed in order that, by virtue of the mercy shown to you, they too may now receive mercy. For God delivered all to disobedience, that he might have mercy upon all.

Homily

Profession of Faith-
