Dear Friends in Christ,

Moses led the people out of slavery in Egypt. They spent 40 years in a desert. Just before they entered the Promised Land flowing with milk and honey, he gave to the people his final instruction.

"Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. ⁷ Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. ⁸ Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem^[a] on your forehead, ⁹ and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." (Deuteronomy 6:6-9).

What was so important? What were these words? "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might!" (Deuteronomy 6:5).

People often tell me that they want to do the right thing. They want to raise their children right. They want to do God's will. Yet they are not always sure what God's will is.

OUR PROGRAM

- Uses texts/materials approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in conformity with the Catechism of the Catholic Church.
- Incorporates catechetical themes such as Revelation, Trinity, Jesus Christ, The Church, Morality, Sacraments and Kingdom of God. Each age group learns about the same themes, but at an age-appropriate level.
- Adults meet in the church while children meet by grade level in classrooms.

POLICIES

Formation is for all adults, teens and children. Each household completes a formation registration form.

- Must be active, registered members of St. Joseph Catholic Church. Please call the parish office at 407-275-0841 or visit stjosephorlando.org if you need to register as a member of the parish.
- Every household is expected to attend Mass weekly, to make consistent sacrificial gifts using the envelopes in the offertory or on-line giving, which financially support all ministries of our parishes. All households are also called to share their time and talents in the parish.

SECURITY PROCEDURES

Security guidelines developed by the Diocese of Orlando are used to keep your children safe. All catechists are fingerprinted and clear a Background Check and learn the Diocesan safe environment training process. No adult without these clearances is permitted in the classroom except for dropping off or picking up your children.

Arrival – Grade school parents, for weeks 1-2, bring kids straight to classroom if registered. For the remainder of the year, parents are to bring children to their grade level catechists in the Church. The catechists will take the children to the hall and the parents will remain behind for adult faith formation. Middle school and high school parents are to enter the social hall through the portico.

<u>Dismissal</u> – For all grade levels, pick up your child at his/her classroom door when directed. Parents/guardians must sign out their children.

<u>Emergency Evacuation</u> – If evacuation of the building is required, catechists will escort your children to a safe location on the parish grounds to meet you.

STUDENT CODE OF CONDUCT

RESPECT:

- Listen to and follow the instructions of the catechist.
- Teasing and name calling of fellow classmates is not tolerated.
- Help keep the room straightened and return supplies as requested.
- Cellphones are not allowed to be used during faith formation. Youth are generally allowed to keep them on their person, but the catechist reserves the right to have students place phones in a safe spot in the classroom during class time to be picked up by the student at the conclusion of class if they deem phones could be / are being a distraction.

SELF-CONTROL:

- Stay seated unless otherwise directed by your catechist.
- Do not leave the room without a catechist's permission.
- ♦ No running is allowed.

PREPAREDNESS:

- Regular, on time attendance is expected for adults and children.
- Class time is limited; prepare for class by using the bathroom prior to sessions.
- Please have a snack or meal before class time to get the most out of the sessions.
- Parents assist their children with any lessons not completed in class.

TARDINESS:

The student is tardy 3 times throughout the course of the year with no excuse note or email notice, it will count as one absence.

RESTROOM USAGE:

- The Students who need to go to the restroom need to have a hall pass.
- The Catechists will send one student at a time with a hall pass.
- Hall monitors will be ensuring that the students are using the restroom in a timely manner. For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. 1 John 5:3

ATTENDANCE:

- † Students are not allowed more than 3 absences without a parent's excuse note prior to the class.
- \$\Psi\$ Students from 1st-5th can submit their excuse note by Friday via email.
- Students from MSYM can submit the excuse note by Monday via email.
- HSYM can submit their excuse note by Wednesday.
- If a religious education student is absent three times with no excuse or notice throughout the year (Fall or Spring), he/she will be no longer be able to receive any sacrament they would have that year, and may need to undergo another full year of faith formation and sacramental prep in order to receive the sacrament.
- If a student who is preparing for sacraments is absent three times with no excuse or notice throughout the semester (Fall or Spring), he/she will be withdrawn from the sacramental preparation program. He/She

DISCIPLINARY ACTION:

- First Offense: Student will be warned by the Catechist and reminded of the Student Code of Conduct.
- ♥ Second Offense: Parents will be notified of the student's misconduct by the catechist or the Formation Coordinator. Misconduct may be noted in the child's records.
- Third Offense: If unacceptable behavior continues, the student will be escorted by a catechist to the social hall to sit for the remainder of the session with the parent or guardian. The Formation Coordinator will speak with the parent(s). Parents may need to teach the remainder of the sessions at home.

SACRAMENTS

The sacraments are "efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us" (CCC 1131).

In other words, a sacrament is a sacred and visible sign that is instituted by Jesus to give us grace, an undeserved gift from God. (See also CCC 1084).

Christ was present at the inception of all of the sacraments, which He instituted 2,000 years ago. Christ is also present every time each sacrament is celebrated. The Catholic Church has all of the seven sacraments instituted by Christ, which include Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony. The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that "the seven sacraments touch all the stages and all important moments of the Christian life" (CCC 1210).

Sacramental Preparation

- ♣ Sacramental Preparation is separate from and *in addition* to faith formation.
- Adults desiring these sacraments should contact Andy Alvarez (Adult Coordinator) at the parish office.

1st Reconciliation and 1st Communion — generally those eligible are in 2nd grade or above and participate regularly at Mass and in

faith formation during the prior school year.

Confirmation – generally those eligible are in 8th grade or above and participate regularly at Mass and faith formation during the prior school year.

Becoming Catholic, OCIA – this process is designed for those adults and children over 7 years of age who have not been baptized and are seeking inclusion in the Catholic Church. For more information, contact Matthew McCauley at the parish office for ages 7-17. Contact Andy Alvarez (Adult Formation) for the adult OCIA.

REGISTERING

Registration for faith formation starts in the beginning of the summer and continues until September 1st. The online registration form is available on the parish website www.stjosephorlando.org during these months. At least one parent or guardian must enroll in Adult Faith Formation and attend in order for their child to be enrolled in Youth Faith Formation. First time students need to submit sacraments certificates. (This applies for students who are doing First Communion (and/or) Confirmation. See website for specific dates and materials fees for Faith Formation and Sacramental Prep.

Youth Ministry

The purpose of this ministry is to involve our youth in our parish and community while deepening their faith and relationship with God.

Middle School Ministry meets every Thursday from 6:30pm – 8pm in the Social Hall. High School Youth Ministry meets every Monday from 6:30-8:00 pm in the social hall.

Youth Group events and activities are typically centered around social, spiritual, and service activities.

Youth Ministry gives teens a great way to make friends and have fun as they live their faith and grow closer to Jesus
